November 17 Open MIC

Phil Bonsiero opened this session with More, Vaya Con Dios, Stand By Me, What A Wonderful World, Sunny Side of the Street and I Could Have Danced All Night. John Lolle and Richard Trasferini decided to team up and played duets. They performed Expectation, Rocket Rock, Wedding Tarantella, I'm In The Mood For Love and the Gloria Polka. We then welcomed a new member Francois Hricak to his first DAC session. He entertained us on his button accordion with a medley of French waltzes. Tip Ciotti from Virginia Beach was visiting his father in Wilmington. He recently started his own club called The Accordion Loves of Virginia which meets the first of the month. He played two French pieces, Spanish Dance #5, Dizzy Fingers and Back to Sorrento. Les and Marilyn Rittle were up next.
